All of these advances can be interpreted as consistent with, "What hath God wrought?!" in like sign of the Pentecost miracle. The Lord has placed an unmistakable premium on the Gospel being proclaimed and understood across the miles and over the ages, as Jesus said, "From Jerusalem, to Judea and Samaria, and even unto the uttermost parts of the earth" (Acts 1:8). And for the work to proceed, God has repeatedly entrusted amazing technological means to the stewardship of evangelical purpose. Of course, there is always a predictable pushback against a worldview that interprets history and its artifacts as serving the cause of Christ. The secular worldview wants every achievement harnessed and owned for this world's sake. What the world accepts not is that all is ultimately and finally intended for God's glory.

As we continue GROWING IN GRACE together, let us affirm and reaffirm a Christian worldview that well knows the kingdom of this world will be – yes, already has been – subjugated to the Kingdom of God. To be sure, everything of and in this world is, one way or another, in service to God's great priority and end time sign revealed by Jesus: "The Gospel of the Kingdom shall be preached in the whole world as a testimony to the nations, and then the end will come" (Mt. 24:14). And that very end is recorded in Revelation 11:15 as the 7th Angel proclaims, "The Kingdom of the world has become the Kingdom of our Lord and of His Christ; and He will reign forever and ever." May those with eyes to see, ears to hear, minds to know, and hearts to understand clearly discern "What hath God wrought?!" Samuel Morse got it in 1844. God help us to always get it as well.
